The bus from Fieldhead to Groby does not stop at the Groby bypass. My business suffers because of this and my family who come from Markfield. Why should people get off at Lena Drive or Glenfield - ridiculous!

The bus routes do not regularly go into the village! From our area. No buses from village to Leicester after 6pm.

The bus service (No 28) is excellent.

The bus service for us is already excellent and reasonably priced.

The bus service in Groby would be immeasurably improved by eliminating indiscriminated long term parking by private vehicles on the bus routes

The bus stop in Sacheveral Way is very rarely used and there is no drop off point opposite. Could this stop be repositioned lower down near the island to enable resident near the island to have opportunity of using 28 & 27 service.

The buses should adhere to the timetable some never arrive at all.

The cost is a lot seeing that the town is only six miles away!

The electronic bus time's system needs expanding and is currently not reliable in giving the correct time for the next bus.

The crossing of the A50 from Groby to pick up Anstey Lane is v. dangerous. A crossing is needed opposite the P.O. to the village hall.

The cycle path between Groby and Field Head stops part way up the busy and narrow A50. Can it be extended?

The light on Fir Tree Lane opposite Fir tree walk has been moved but still doesn't light the first half of Fir tree walk, due to high conifers.

1) Confusing 2) Unsightly Bins 3) Attracting ants 4) Irregular collection times Blue bags, Black and Brown bins, Boxes.

1) Once a fortnight is not enough for household refuse. 2) More means of recycling plastic, cardboard etc.

1) Not enough products recycled eg. Plastic cardboard 2) Fortnightly collection of household waste inadequate. Should be weekly

2-week collection of waste in the summer will result in rat problems.

2 week rubbish collection not adequate unless plastic and cardboard can be recycled too.

2 weeks for black bins is long time

2 weeks for collection domestic waste too long especially in hot weather, decomposition maggots and flies. The bag and box can be hazardous on pavements and in bad weather also youths sometimes - tip up. Difficult to store all different containers look unsightly on front of properties.

2 weeks is too long!!

2 Weeks wait for removal of domestic waste is too long.

A 2-week collection of dustbin rubbish is not acceptable - smelly in the summer, yet it does attempt to limit people's rubbish.

A family make far too much rubbish to fit in ONE black bin fortnightly. Needs to be emptied WEEKLY also because of the smell. Blue box is too large to store inside and gets wet and dirty outside as does blue bag.

A fortnightly collection for household waste is not often enough, especially in summer. Garden waste O.K.

A fortnightly collection is inadequate. It is confusing as to exactly what can go into the blue box.

All rubbish not cleared. Bins left on footpaths.

Although I have a bigger bin it is still not enough while it is a fortnightly.

Although our rubbish is placed on our boundary on the correct day it is not always emptied. Resulting in the blue box contents sometimes going into the black bin.

Although we have a car and go to the tip, everyone hasn't got a car, and it isn't always convenient to take to the tip if the dustbin men leave the excess. This could lead to fly tipping. Any big articles should be collected free.

Although, I think that all properties should rec. the larger bins because if you have a busy wk for rubbish i.e. birthdays, private parties etc then unless you remove the rubbish yourself then it has to stay at property for up to four weeks. Also, if the lid is left slightly open then the bags are removed and left on footpath. This should not happen due to health & safety.

As a family of five we struggle to put our rubbish out every two weeks. Our bins are always overflowing we have to make regular trips to the tip.

As a family of four, we accumulate a lot of rubbish, despite using the bag & box it recycling services, and also clothes, a more frequent collection would be beneficial for rubbish.

As long as bins are emptied the scheme is ok. Have experienced both refuse and garden waste missed or not fully emptied.

As now rubbish is only collected every 2 weeks.

As pensioners we are paying more for a system where we do the sorting and bin moving.

As was stated in the village journal I think we should have weekly collections

As `pick-ups` are NOT frequent enough.

Because it has meant a 2 weekly collection of household waste and my wheelie bin is not big enough. Besides in the summer particularly it begins to smell and attract flies. Still no recycling of plastics and cardboard. No need for bottle / cans to be collected as this is already covered with bottle and can banks outside Budgens / Co-op.

Because it is only collected every 2 weeks instead of weekly and the containers (boxes) have no lids so encouraging rodents

Because plastic & cardboard recycling not yet commenced.

Because when they only collect waste every two weeks it's a problem because there are 3 adults and 2 children in the house making more waste. Suggest should be weekly collections or bigger bins.

Bi-weekly collections cause problems if away for/or miss collection day. Bins fall over in high winds. Bins too big for small gardens. But a must due to bi-weekly collections.

Bigger bin or weekly collection. Collection of cardboard and plastic.

Bin men don't take excess rubbish.

Bin not big enough for a family's waste of 2 weeks.

Bin not big enough for family of 4, even with recycling, should be weekly, especially in summer due to smell.

Bin not collected weekly. Smell if bin over full.

Bins (black) need collection weekly. Recycling should include cardboard and plastic.

Black boxes should be provided with lid. Collections should be weekly for household waste not fortnightly - is this not reasonable given the high community charge increase!

Black household bin collection fortnightly NOT frequently enough.

Black wheelie bin not big enough for 2 weeks refuse. No recycling of plastics & cardboard.

Collection every 14 days for a 4-person household is not enough in relation to size of bin.

Despite recycling all items that should be recycled, wheelie bin still does not hold all rubbish over a 2-week period. Why do we not have plastic bottles recycled like the other areas, this may help?

Despite recycling as much as we can we can't usually get all waste into black bin when collected fortnightly.

Despite several complaints to H.B.B.C. the collection staff persist in leaving empty bins on `the pavement`! These are a hazard and if householders place full bins on pavements we would be contravening collection directives! `WHY`, as a resident of ROOKERY LANE do 2 vehicles collect? One empties bins in PYM LEY Gardens and a SECOND crew arrives to empty bins on the opposite side of the road known as ROOKERY LANE. This is method study gone wrong.

Didn't know about it. Parents do it.

Difficult to restrict waste to the capacity of a wheelie bin, which is only collected ever two weeks. Do not like wheelie bins to be seen outside people's houses. Our bin has to be dragged up 5 steps and through a utility room. My parents are 98 and 96 - they cannot take the bin to the bottom of the drive. I asked for this to be done but it rarely is.

Do not fully understand it? What can/ can't be put in?

Do not recycle plastic / cardboard with other household recyclable waste. Boxes not big enough and should have lids. Two weekly collections not satisfactory.

Do not take `heavy` compost bins. No plastic re-cycling.

Does not allow for recycling of plastic and cardboard. We have noticed brown bin takes less waste than old green bag system.

Does not collect plastic and cardboard.

Does not recycle cardboard and plastic

Doesn't include plastic & cardboard or household batteries.

Domestic household waste is only collected once every 2 weeks. So I take it to the tip myself. Garden waste is collected every 2 weeks and in winter there is very little. Overall, appalling service.

Domestic refuse bin should be emptied in a weekly basis as before. Two weeks is too long in hot weather. Professional disinfect ion of bins would also help.

Domestic refuse needs to be collected weekly.

Domestic rubbish collection does not include plastics. Garden rubbish volumes significantly less than domestic, but has 50% of collection.

Domestic waste should be collected each week. Plastic should be recycled.

Domestic waste: I have noticed that if a bag is protruding from the top (ie the bin lid is not completely closed) the offending bag has been dumped on the driveway. The remaining services have been excellent.

Don't collect plastic bottles. Don't take all types of paper.

Don't take plastic bottles, cardboard.

Doorstep recycling of plastic is not available

Doesn't collect Card or Plastics

Due to a less frequent collection the bin is too small, subsequently creating smells. The box for tins is too small, needs a lid (as we have small children), and too much storage space required.

Due to narrow paths and steps bins most heavy and awkward especially for Elderly. Prefer bag system by far. Also bins look ugly and block paths.

During summer months general household waste should be collected weekly - Health and Safety. Refuse collectors not returning bins onto property - leaving on pavement despite requests not to.

Dustbins need emptying weekly.

Dustbins need to be collected weekly.

Dustbins need weekly emptying not fortnightly, especially in summer.

Dustbins smell badly after 2 weeks and should be emptied weekly. Need to take cardboard. My husband cuts his hands cleaning out tins!

Dustbins will smell in summer, if only emptied every 2 weeks.

Emptying the dustbin once a fortnight only in hot weather is unhealthy.

Envelopes cardboard

Even after recycling household waste my bin is still full after 2 weeks.

Even though we recycle bottles, cans etc as a family of 4 soon to be 5 and not entitled to a larger bin, we already struggle to keep rubbish down. When the new baby arrives it will be impossible. We would benefit from recycling plastics & cardboard, then our problem would be solved.

Even with the recycling collection only collecting rubbish once a fortnight is not enough.

Every 2 weeks are enough suggestion refuse ever week for 3 then 1 garden waste a month

Excess is not collected therefore one needs to use car to visit tip

Excess rubbish no recycling for goods/old pillows, old shoes. Means trip to tip

Facilities should be provided to recycle plastics & cardboard from home.

Families find it hard with litter every fortnight.

Family waste should be disposed of on weekly basis for good hygiene.

Feel black bins need emptied weekly in summer months

Less Green waste. More household waste collections

For a family there is too much garden refuse collection and not enough waste collection

For a large family collection of rubbish fortnightly is not enough.

Fortnightly collection encouraged pests to breed. Bins not big enough as council will not take plastic, cardboard. Blue box not big enough for tins & glass etc. Blue bag blows away. Why do we have to pay annually for 2nd brown bin when I'm helping meet Government targets?

Fortnightly collection inadequate. Have expressed my views to Hinckley & Bosworth, never got a reply!

Fortnightly collection is a HEALTH RISK especially in the summer months.

Fortnightly collection is unhealthy. Just imagine the smell in summer. No problem with the quantity we recycle. This is mainly done at County Hall as for some insane reason we can't put cardboard or plastic in our blue box.

Fortnightly collection not enough

Garden Waste should be collected 1 week per month, household waste 3 weeks per month.

General household rubbish should not be collected fortnightly. It should be weekly as it used to be before the introduction of the new larger bins.

Generally yes but in order to cram two weeks non-recyclable rubbish into one bin requires me to climb into the bin to stamp it down - I have lost my balance on occasion and fallen - slight injury.

Go back to once a week domestic rubbish collection. The bin men have got an easy job, they could do more. Will not take additional bags on the floor. Do not put dustbins back again, dustmen need more to do.

Green waste at certain times of the year mounts into large amounts, having to burn it. The green bag system with small branches being tied up into bundles was a far better system.

Green waste to be collected every 3 weeks

Have more rubbish than one bin every 2 weeks. (2 adults 2 children)

Health hazard especially in summer if household waste only collected fortnightly. Not enough space in one bin for 2 weeks rubbish. Garden refuse collection started too early when it would have been more helpful to collect household rubbish weekly.

Higher cost lower service. Encouraging vermin into Groby.

Household refuse - not frequent enough, bin becomes smelly and unhygienic. Recycling - bulky items such as plastic and cardboard take up a lot of household refuse.

household refuse collection 2 weekly is not often enough.

Household refuse needs to be collected each week not every two weeks.

Household rubbish should be collected every week, especially in summer months as could become health issue ie-disposable nappies and BBQ waste.

Household rubbish should be collected once a week, NOT once every other week

Household waste needs to be taken weekly

Household waste should be collected every week. In the summer the dustbins are going to smell. We pay more poll tax and get less service.

Household waste should be collected more than once a fortnight.

Household Waste should be collected weekly.

Household waste (black bins) should be weekly.

Household dustbins only emptied once a fortnight. In summer- health hazard.

Huge bins that I have to drag through my garage. Requires starting my car twice for every collection.

I am at work 8.30 - 5.00 pm Mon-Fri & my bins remain in the drive telling would be burglars that the house is empty until my return

I am concerned about the summer. Our rubbish smells badly on a 2-week cycle.

I applaud the green collection but it should not have made the general collection of rubbish a fortnightly event. This has caused me to travel to the tip to get rid of rubbish in between the collection with no reduction of council tax. At a time when the collectors empty my green waste which is only a tenth full! A very poor system, which hasn't been thought out properly.

I cannot carry the box from my rear garden round to the roadside. It is too heavy for me. Someone stole my brown wheelie bin.

I do not think rubbish should be rationed. The amount we pay for council tax, we should have the right to have any amount of rubbish (within reason of course) collected each week.

I feel compost collection is justified in the summer months. But not in the winter when cleaning of the gardens done. Wouldn't it be better to collect household rubbish weekly in the winter?

I had a problem getting rid of plastics but there is now a recycling point for plastics near Budgens.

I have a family of 4 recycle my cans tins paper jars even plastic at Budgens yet my garden is full of rubbish bags which is't hygienic for my children playing in the garden we need either a bigger bin (which I'm not paying £30 for that's what I pay my council tax for) or the bins emptying more than once every 2 weeks

I have no problems myself. I would like everybody to hide his or her bins.

I have to drive to Glenfield to recycle card and that is by far the biggest volume of recyclable item we have. Quite often the bins are full and I have to return another time.

I have to recycle all my own cardboard and plastic

I live in a small house and the box for glass bottles is not an option, and I have to have my blue bag in the kitchen. Think recycling is good but you need space for the receptacles.

I never know when which wheelie bin is going to be collected.

I recycle everything possible & still I have 2 340lt bins full within the 2 weeks. Therefore I am making more trips to the City Council tips than ever before to dispose of my rubbish.

I still feel very restricted by what is taken and feel more cardboard and packaging could be dealt with. Other councils recycle much more. They have been slow on the uptake.

I take it myself as I do not like the full boxes/bags outside my house plus they never give me back my clean bin or bag.

I think the fortnightly collection is poor

I think the main refuse bins should be collected weekly not fortnightly.

I think the recycling should be extended

I think the waste should be collected weekly the recycling system should include collection for plastic bottles

I want the cardboard & plastic recycled

I work away a lot & left my recycling out & the bin was stolen. Also, once a fortnight for refuses collection is not enough.

I would like the black bins emptied weekly

If our bin is full, the bin men take out the extra bag and leave it on the roadside.

If the borough council can't take all-recycling, then there needs to be local facilities to enable people to dispose of their waste thoughtfully.

In today's society, even if we recycle, when you have a family there is a lot of refuse - 2 weeks collection is no good.

Inadequate recycling system. Why they don't accept cardboard, H.D.P.E. and P.E.T. is baffling. P.E.T. was a recycling solution to glass and our waste would fit perfectly if they accepted this. Travelling to our village sites is not a fair solution.

Inadequate space for 4 adults. Impossible if you have family/friends over. Fortnightly collection leaves smells. Causes litter problems in village when bins are overflowing or tipped over.

Insufficient space in black bin for two weeks waste for a family of four. Recycling Of plastics and cardboard needed.

Insufficient capacity with wheelie bins. No flexibility. Service led rather than customer / consumer led.

Insufficient collections which in summer will lead to hygiene problems, increase in smell, possible increase in fly tipping and general litter problems

Insufficient general rubbish capacity. Sometimes one bin is not enough.

Insufficient space in bin for a family of four & recycling tub limited compared with other villages.

Insufficient waste collections. Also they are collecting bins to make ease of emptying and then leaving bins three to four houses away.

Insufficient clearance

Introduced in winter months. Already have a problem with flies from landfill, what will it be like in summer months.

It is an excellent system, but we need the household waste collecting one a week, not fortnightly.

It is disgusting and unhealthy to empty bin 2 weekly we are becoming akin to a third world country

It is excellent but would like to recycle plastics too.

It is far more trouble than the old system. What to save and what not to and 2 week collections for household waste is too long.

It is filthy and disgusting not mention a health hazard only having collections once a fortnight.

It is impossible to fit our waste into the black bin. I fully use the blue box and bag scheme for tins, bottles and papers. But I simply cannot reduce my waste anymore.

It is impossible to restrict waste to a 2 weekly collection even by recycling items

It is not comprehensive enough i.e. cardboard, plastic etc.

It is rather limited

It remains to be seen how the fortnightly collection of refuse will operate during the summer months when food etc will decompose in bins.

My wife has health problems, we drink bottled water (wife had nephritis in 1973) - bin is too small (larger one)

Need cardboard & plastic & paper waste collected. 1 bin emptied every 2 weeks not enough. We have to travel to tip regularly with extra rubbish.

Not enough refuse collections. One every two weeks is not sufficient

Not enough selecting - card and plastic if removed into separate containers would reduce `daily` rubbish in black bins

Not frequent enough collection.

Not frequent enough for black or blue bins

On occasions we have had to call bin men back to empty our bins. Once had to phone H & B to get our brown bin emptied - took 2 separate visits by different vans to get both emptied.

On occasion picking up rubbish after dustbin men been if anything falls out of Bins into lorry they leave if on road

Once a fortnight is not sufficient they leave rubbish on the pavements if not placed in bins

Once every 2 weeks is definitely not frequent enough, particularly for household (black bin) rubbish. My bin is always over full.

Once every 2 weeks is not enough for household rubbish

One collection every 2 weeks ridiculous for family.

One collection every two weeks is NOT enough.

One small box is not enough. Have to travel to Whetstone tip 2 weekly!!

One visit every 2 weeks is not enough in summer it will be disgusting with the heat

One wheelie bin is not enough to take our rubbish even with recycling The refuse collectors will not even take the rubbish if the lid is not down properly they do not leave the bin where they got it from I have already lost one bin they will not take cardboard boxes unless in the bin which we cannot do because then we would have less room for rubbish what will happen in the hot weather when we have bags rotting in the heart

Only coming once per 2 weeks, whets it going to be like in summer! I dread to think, we already have rats around, it just encourages more to leave the bins unemptied.

Only once a fortnight

Only one black bin has been supplied, whereas multiple brown bins are supplied. We require a further black bin.

Open blue boxes can be dangerous with glass and tins (sometimes left out all day) for young children or when people are returning from pubs drunk

Other councils collect plastic and cardboard re-cycling - why do we not have that? Garden waste collection can be reduced to monthly or 3 weekly - not needed in winter.

Refuse and recycling should be collected from our property, not only taken if on the boundary. We pay a lot of council tax - this should be part of the service.

Refuse bins should be collected more often (eg once a week) instead of once a fortnight. In summer, refuse in the bins will likely decompose causing a health hazard.

Refuse collection every 2 weeks is unacceptable - unhealthy and if you are unwell on the day and unable to put the bin out then it is a month of rubbish festering away. The recycling does not take cardboard or plastic so we still have to use other recycling facilities elsewhere, when we travel nearby. This is not very convenient. Why does every local council have different recycling arrangements? It is noticed that people put out the wrong bins etc on collection days even though H & BBC issued leaflets. So it is obviously confusing.

Refuse collection inadequate needs to be weekly

Refuse collection only fortnightly should be weekly. There should also be more recycling points to include plastic bottles and clothes collections.

Refuse Collection reduced to fortnightly - having to make trips to City dumps. WHAT AM I PAYING RATES FOR?

Refuse collection should be every week not fortnightly.

Refuse collection should be weekly

Refuse must be emptied weekly. Heat in summer will cause problems (maggots and smells)

Refuse needs to be collected weekly instead of 2 weekly. I recycle card and plastic bottles but still have insufficient space in dustbin. Garden rubbish would suffice monthly.

Still no collection service for plastics, cardboard etc.

Still nowhere to recycle cardboard, only just had supplied plastic bottle recycling at Budgens, which is not convenient for me.

Super system but we need to be able to do plastic and cardboard, instead of using petrol to take these items to other recycling banks.

The bins are huge this encourages to use more rubbish, what about giving out free or heavily subsidised compost bins for houses

The bins are not large enough for a large family and you are not allowed to put out extra bags (why not?)

The bins should be emptied once a week, not every two weeks. Maybe household on a Friday and bags of papers and box of bottles on a Wednesday. We pay enough council tax for this!! And brown bins once every three weeks.

The black bins should be emptied every week whilst the green bins should be emptied every fortnightly also the re-cycle men take our blue bag away and forget to leave one for us and at times the recycle bin is not emptied at all

The collections are not sufficient for a family. Even using the recycling fully. They (Hinckley and Bosworth) do not collect plastic, cardboard and one a fortnight collections are inadequate. They may save money but we do not see the benefit. Also, having old meat uncollected for 2 weeks particularly in summer is a potential health hazard. Look how good Blaby districts is.

The dustbins are too small. Should be collected weekly.

The existing is good, but I have to travel weekly to recycle cardboard and plastic drink bottles.

The fortnightly domestic household waste collection is insufficient especially in hot weather - an affront to modern civilised living standards!

The household waste should be collected more often - the fortnightly bins become `overfull` and I expect they will become smelly in the summer. Also if you miss the household collection due to holidays (family or Bank) you have to wait a month.

The new system is helpful but not a complete solution, because we still have to go to County Hall to deposit plastic waste, cardboard and much more paper than will go into the blue bag.

The new system was started up in the winter when there was no problem with the heat and flies. We only get 1 rubbish collection every 2 wks. It will be bad in the summer for families plus the dustmen are very particular as to what's classed as rubbish & if you happen to have extra they refuse to take it.

The recycling part should cater for ALL recyclable materials.

The recycling scheme is v good but I feel the refuse should be emptied weekly instead of fortnightly.

The removal of household waste every 2 weeks is inadequate.

The unsightly horrible wheelie bins. They ruin the village.

The village as a whole looks utterly dreadful on Bin Collection Days with them all out on the fronts.

The waste collection is only made every fortnight for general waste the wheelie bin does not hold a fortnights general waste

The wheelie bin was stolen. It stands outside the house all day when I am at work, advertising the opportunity for theft both of the bin and the house. They should put it back in place.

The wheelie bins are not big enough if they are to continue fortnightly collections. We pay more council tax for fewer collections. In the summer the smell will be really horrible, living close to a landfill site there will be even more flies, maggots and stench than usual.

There are only 2 of us living here but a wheelie bin collection every 2 weeks isn't enough, even when we recycle everything we can. We need to be able to recycle card, envelopes & plastic. We also need to be given a clean blue bag each time. We either get a dirty one (not ours) or nothing at all.

There is no collection of plastic or cardboard

We are now doing most of the recycling ourselves.

We get little enough from our council tax paid to Hinckley and Bosworth towards facilities in Groby. To enjoy the benefits enjoyed by Hinckley residents is not convenient and would be costly to travel to. Therefore until we see more investment by H&BBC in this area we would not agree to pay more.

We have already had a 75% increase in parish council tax - what is this being used for?

We have just had a large increase.

We pay a lot as it is and still have to visit a tip to dispose of the extra rubbish we accumulate due to poor refuse collection
